General Information

What is the Tutor-Mentor Program?

- The Tutor-Mentor Program partners with public and parochial schools as well as after school programs within Minneapolis and St. Paul.
- Tutor-Mentors spend time assisting students on academic work or with enrichment activities.

Who can participate?

- Any student wanting to gain a deeper awareness of themselves and the surrounding community.
- Many students volunteer on their own, while others become involved through coursework.

What are the requirements?

- Tutor-Mentors must attend an initial training session and a mid semester reflection session.
- Tutor-Mentors must complete 10 sessions in order to receive recognition for participation.

When, where & how?

- Tutor-Mentors are placed at a site based on their availability.
- Sessions run Monday - Thursday from 7:30a.m. - 6:30p.m.
- Carpools or bus pools are arranged through the Tutor-Mentor Program.
- Tutor-Mentors volunteer once a week for 1.5-2 hours during the semester excluding breaks and finals week.

What is the registration process?

- Registrations are available at the CILCE Center (MHC 153) or the CILCE Office (MHC 159).
- Complete the registration form by the required date, attend training, receive placement, and you're on your way!
