Why has evolution been so controversial among Christians?

In a talk heavily illustrated with images and cartoons from the 1920s to today, Dr. Davis will present many of the reasons why American Christians have found evolution so objectionable. He will outline the main ideas and attitudes associated with "scientific creationism," then draw a comparison with "intelligent design." The lecture will conclude with examples of Christian thinkers who accept biological evolution while affirming the orthodox creeds.
